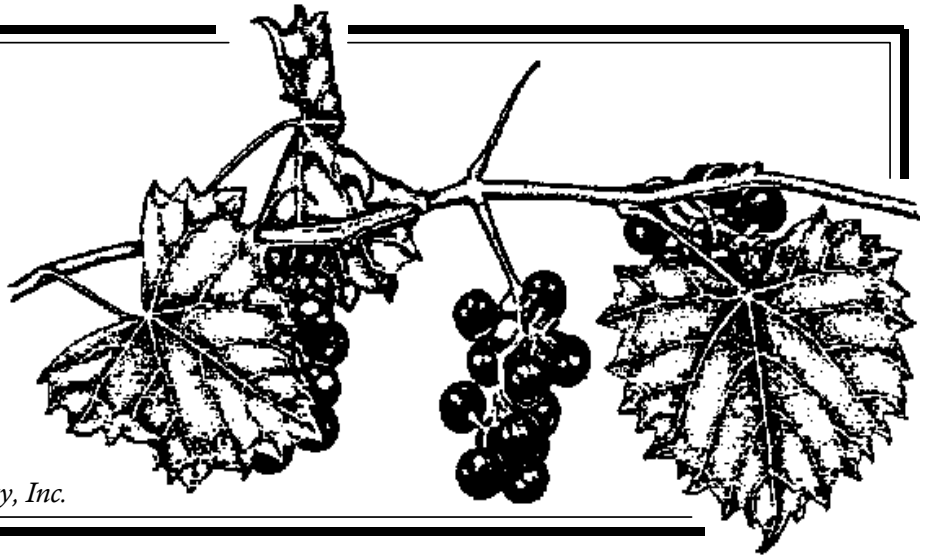

Jim, a sod farmer and nurseryman, was “locked out” of his favorite fishing and water skiing area because of sea grass damage. Instead of just finding another place to enjoy the water, he decided it was time to take action so he developed a system of filling cloth sleeves with sand and seed to fill the ruts left by boat propellers in the shallow waters of Tampa Bay. The seeds took root as the sleeves disintegrated. In pursuit of his hobby, Jim had founded Seagrass Recovery.

In Klinkenberg's 2008 book, Pilgrim in the Land of Alligators, Jeff takes us on a hop, skip and a jump down memory lane to meet an arresting array of characters from Florida's more colorful past.

For those that are new to the Sunshine State: these are probably not people you have encountered before, like Al Tomaini, the circus giant at 8' 4" that started Giant's Camp Restaurant in Gibsonton along with his diminutive wife, Jeanie who was just 2'6". Or Ricou Browning, the original Gill Man from the film *Creature from the Black Lagoon*.

Those of us who grew up in Florida vaguely remember the old tales, but the magic is Klinkenberg's way of telling the story; like Babe Ruth's fear of alligators while training in St. Pete in the springtime - or Marjorie Rawling's life and writings in Cross Creek - or William De Turk the Carilloner at Bok Tower Sanctuary.

And if you are the adventurous sort, you will enjoy hearing about Greg Whidden, the wild hog catcher that used dogs to run down the feral varmints and then went in single handed to tie up the furious beasts.

So, come along for the ride and meet the weird and wonderful, eclectic mix of quirky characters from Florida's past through these 208 colorful pages that Klinkenberg has assembled for his dear readers.

WMNF Native Landscape Workday A Success!

I want to give a big **Thank You** to the SNPS volunteers who came out to WMNF and worked hard installing native plants. **Janet Bowers, Vicki Sinclair, Mike and Barbara Fite, John Walter, and Lara** (my fiancé) are awesome gardeners, they got right to work and knew exactly what to do. Together with WMNF volunteers **Gail Carroll** - who has been indispensable in making this project work - and her husband **Paul Carroll**, we were able to get all the plants installed in the right locations. We were also able to supply them with drip-lines from the irrigation system that has been totally refurbished and redesigned for water conservation by Paul. It looks great, and I'm really proud that SNPS has stepped up to support WMNF in their efforts to establish and maintain a native landscape that demonstrates a real commitment to the environment.

Our additions to the station include some great wildflowers like *Penstemon multiflorus*, *Flaveria linearis*, *Calamintha*, *Ruellia* and *Silphium*. We planted some *Amorpha fruticosa*, *Callicarpa* and *Yucca filamentosa*, as well as grasses and a few vines, *Eragrostis*, *Muhlenbergia* and *Bignonia capreolata*. We even did a butterfly garden with some good host plants like *Asclepias tuberosa*, *Passiflora suberosa*, and *Gnaphalium* among others.

Afterward, Paul was an excellent tour guide for our walk through of the WMNF station which is impressive; it's state of the art and very eclectic. If you don't know about WMNF, they are listener-supported, commercial-free, community radio. Their programming includes a grassroots local emphasis and their mission embraces the importance of environmentalism. The majority of their budget - 70% - is provided by donations from individual listener-supporters. They don't get funding from a university or a big company. As they say on the website, "In an age when a few large corporations own the majority of media outlets, and newsrooms are shrinking across the country, community radio is more important than ever."

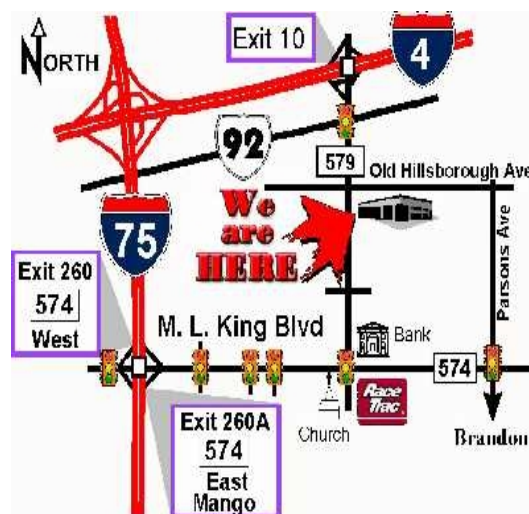
Take I-4 to Exit 10 (just east of I-75). Go south for two blocks. The office is at the corner of Old Hillsborough Road and County Road 579.
